## **Hamilton County ADAS Board surveys community leaders**

CINCINNATI—The Hamilton County Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ADAS) Board (<http://www.hamilton-co.org/adas/>) is currently conducting two community surveys to assess community members’ interest in and opinions about the effective delivery of alcohol and drug abuse prevention and treatment services within their communities.

The Community Stakeholders Survey is being mailed to more than 500 individuals in Hamilton County representing a wide range of community leaders in such areas as business, health care, religion, and social services. This survey is being mailed the week of April 7.

The Community Readiness Survey was distributed on April 7 to 625 randomly selected Hamilton County residents. This survey has been used across the country by many communities. It assesses the readiness of adults to accept responsibility to work with the community’s youth to prevent drug abuse.

The ADAS Board encourages all who receive surveys to take a few moments to fill them out. The surveys can be returned using the included self-addressed, postage-paid envelopes. The ADAS Board appreciates the efforts of all who participate.
