## **ADAS Board and providers host Recovery Month events**

### **Hamilton County Proclamation, Reds Recovery Night and co-occurring disorders conference kick off National Recovery Month (September)**

**CINCINNATI**—September marks the 16<sup>th</sup> annual monthly observance of National Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month. This year's theme is *Join the Voices of Recovery...Healing Lives, Families & Communities!*

To celebrate Recovery Month, Hamilton County community service providers are hosting a co-occurring disorders conference September 16<sup>th</sup>, a Reds Recovery Night September 23<sup>rd</sup> and numerous other events. To kick off National Recovery Month, Hamilton County commissioners issued a proclamation declaring the month of September National Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month throughout Hamilton County, and stating "...recognition and gratitude are to be given to the Hamilton County Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ADAS) Board, its providers, and partners for their outstanding services to Hamilton County."

The co-occurring disorders conference, entitled *Integrated Treatment of Co-Occurring Disorders of Substance Abuse and Mental Illness*, will be held at the Children's Hospital Medical Center MERC Auditorium from 8 AM to 5:30 PM. At least 50 percent of persons diagnosed with mental illness will also have a substance abuse diagnosis during their lifetime. The conference will explore culturally-sensitive evidence-based integrated treatment for both mental illness and substance abuse disorders in children, adolescents and adults. Recovery Night with the Reds, organized by the Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration, Faces and Voices of Recovery, Ohio Citizen Advocates, and ADAS-funded agencies, honors those who are finding success in recovery. Prior to the game, the Cincinnati Reds will recognize several area residents currently in recovery. Also, 500 local residents in recovery will be treated to tickets to the game against Philadelphia.
