CINCINNATI METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA

Population density is calculated by dividing the total number of persons in a jurisdiction by the number of acres within that jurisdiction. The numeric change in population density between 2000 and 2004 multiplied by 25 computes the change in persons per 25 acres. The most densely populated jurisdiction in the CMSA, Elmwood Place, in 2000, had a density of 13 people per acre. In 2004, this number dropped close to 12 people per acre meaning in 4 years, Elmwood Place lost close to 1 person per acre (or 24 persons per 25 acres).
