We consider this appeal on the accelerated calendar, and this judgment entry is not an opinion of the court. *See* Rep.Op.R. 3.1; App.R. 11.1(E); 1st Dist. Loc.R. 11.1.1.

Defendant-appellant Christopher Hladik has appealed from the trial court’s entry convicting him, following a bench trial, of driving without a license in violation of R.C. 4510.12(A)(1).

In a single assignment of error, Hladik argues “[t]he trial court erred in convicting defendant-appellant, Christopher Hladik. There was no probable cause for the initial stop, and the alleged offense never occurred.” Because Hladik did not file a motion to suppress or a motion to dismiss, we treat his assignment of error as a challenge to the weight and sufficiency of the evidence supporting his conviction. Hladik failed to file a transcript of the proceedings, as is required by App.R. 9(B). *See State v. Bumu*, 1st Dist. Hamilton No. C-160492, 2017-Ohio-6901, ¶ 15. Without a transcript we cannot review the evidence presented, and we must presume the

regularity of the trial court's proceedings and affirm. *Id.* at ¶ 16; *Knapp v. Edwards Laboratories*, 61 Ohio St.2d 197, 199, 400 N.E.2d 384 (1980).

Hladik also argues that he has a right to operate a motor vehicle without a license. This argument is meritless. *See State v. Matthews*, 2d Dist. Greene No. 2015-CA-73, 2016-Ohio-5055, ¶ 7.

Hladik's assignment of error is overruled, and the judgment of the trial court is affirmed.

A certified copy of this judgment entry shall constitute the mandate, which shall be sent to the trial court under App.R. 27. Costs shall be taxed under App.R. 24.
